1. The exhibitor in accordance with the 4-H Club Home Economics Programs must have made all entries in these divisions.
2. All entries shall have been completed since the previous year's Fair as a part of a recognized 4-H Project.
3. LIMIT: 6 different exhibits, each to be listed separately and identified by name (dress, blouse, etc.) on entry form. Different means unlike in material, pattern or style. An exhibit may consist of an item judged individually, a two-piece outfit will be judged as a single item, or a coordinated exhibit of from three to five items not judged elsewhere. Accessories include hats, scarves, gloves, i.e. wearable textiles, knits, crochet, etc.

DIVISION 926–4-H EDUCATIONAL DISPLAYS/POSTERS

Entries due Thursday, September 14 by 7 p.m.

1. All classes open to Junior, Intermediate and Senior members.
2. 4-H Primary members can enter in classes 1 and 2 only.
3. Primary members may receive participation ribbons only.
4. Only one educational display/poster will be accepted per exhibitor.
5. Please Note: If your project area or club requires that a poster be turned in and you are involved in more than one project, only one will be accepted for judging in this class.
6. Please include both the following items on the back of your poster: member's name and 4-H project area (dogs, dairy, rabbit, etc.).

An educational display stimulates thought, teaches facts or shows a process. It may result in action on the reader's part. The educational display can take the form of a poster, a tabletop display, a mobile or large display. Displays have less than 60 seconds to get their message across. Display may show any topic of an educational nature. The display may include sound, motion, etc.

Ideas and helpful hints for your poster/display

1. Check your spelling
2. Have a title for your project
3. Have a 1-2 inch border
4. Be able to read text from 10 feet away (for example 1/2" letters)
