1. “Rock of Ages”
2. “Mendocino Rock-Star”

Use a majority of gold and yellow flowers  
A tall vertical design – include any form of a Star(s) shape.

### **DIVISION 993–ADVANCED ARRANGEMENTS**

Open to junior exhibitors who have won 10 or more blue ribbons at an organized flower show.
